A GOD WE CAN SEE

Has anyone ever asked you to draw a picture of God? It sounds like the perfect Sunday school project, doesn't it? Imagine being given a blank piece of paper, lots of crayons, a dose of childlike creativity, and then being asked to show someone else what God is like by drawing a picture.



But could crayons and paper even do the job? Maybe you would want something much fancier like glitter or shiny stickers. Maybe one piece of paper wouldn't even do the job, and you'd need some tape to put several different pictures together. Maybe the task would seem so impossible that you would just stare at your piece of paper in wonder and amazement.

God can be portrayed in so many different ways that no two drawings would probably look the same. But as John reminds us today, "no one has ever seen God" (1:18). In the end, there is no picture we could draw that would be able to capture all the beauty and mystery and goodness that is God.

But we have far more than a picture; we have a person! It is Jesus, "the only Son," who has revealed God's heart to us. In his care for the poor, his acceptance of outcasts, and his compassion toward sinners, Jesus shows us what no one has ever seen: the face of God. That's why we call him the "Word made flesh." Jesus translates the mystery of God into something we can see and touch: hands to hold us, ears to listen to us, feet to walk beside us throughout our whole lives—even to the cross. He lives among us today in the life of our neighbor, and wherever two or three are gathered to share his meal. Our God is truly with us, and like a person with a box of crayons and infinite creativity, never tires of drawing us into the mystery.
