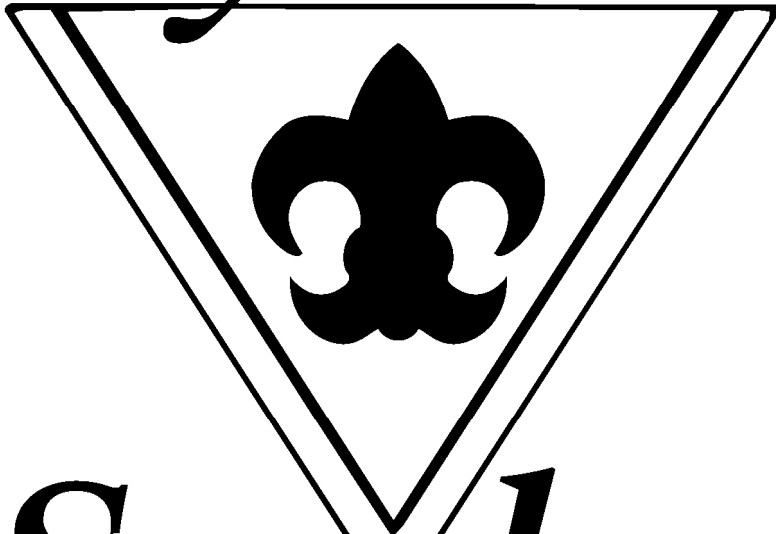



**FIRST READING** *Isaiah 40:21–31*

**A** A reading from Isaiah chapter forty.

*The Judeans in exile have a good reason to be hopeful: the one who will bring them to freedom is the God who created the world, the God who subdues the rulers of the earth and gives strength to those who are weary.*

<sup>21</sup>Have you not known? Have you not heard?  
 Has it not been told you from the beginning?  
 Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth?

<sup>22</sup>It is he who sits above the circle of the earth,

## SECOND READING *1 Corinthians 9:16–23*

**A** A reading from 1 Corinthians chapter nine.

*God entrusted Paul with the responsibility of bringing the gospel to diverse people. Hence the focus of Paul's ministry is not his own rights or privileges as an apostle but the privilege of serving God by freely sharing the good news of Christ with others.*

<sup>16</sup>If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! <sup>17</sup>For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my

own will, I am entrusted with a commission. <sup>18</sup>What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

<sup>19</sup>For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. <sup>20</sup>To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. <sup>21</sup>To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. <sup>22</sup>To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. <sup>23</sup>I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

## Today we welcome our BSA units as they celebrate Boy Scout Sunday.

**Cub Scout Pack 39** meets on Monday evenings at 7:00PM, upstairs in the educational building. The pack is divided into dens, grouped by age and is for boys in grades 1-5. There are currently 11 adult leaders and 34 boys registered.

Some of the activities and accomplishments they enjoy are Good turn Service Projects including Scouting For Food Campaign and Christmas caroling at Twin Lakes Community; Scout Sunday Observation; Blue and Gold Banquet celebrating birthday of Cub Scouting; Pinewood Derby; Webelos Summer Camp and family camping at Woodfield Scout Preservation; walking in the Burlington Christmas Parade; Cub Scout Twilight Camp; popcorn sales and a Webelos-Ree day trip to Camp Cherokee to learn about Boy Scouting. The pack was recognized again in 2008 for earning the Summertime Pack Award; the Centennial National Quality Unit Award; and for participating in the Friends of Scouting campaign.

**Boy Scout Troop 39** meets on Monday at 7:00 P.M. in the Coleman house. Membership is 38 scouts and 22 adults. The troop is an active ministry of Macedonia Lutheran Church and is open to all boys who have completed the fifth grade. The troop has a very active, well-rounded outdoor program. Some of the troop's regular adventures are a weeklong summer encampment at Camp Cherokee in Caswell County, camping, canoeing, rafting, backpacking, snow skiing, and a number of other fun activities. There is also a Venture patrol for the older scouts which meet in the Scout Hut. This Venture group participates in more High Adventure activities. The Boy Scouts are also involved in a number of service projects in the community. Service projects include helping out at Twin Lakes Community, the Alamance CROP Walk, the Meals on Wheels Duck Race, and several Eagle projects which help the whole community. The troop earned the Centennial National Quality Unit Award in 2008. The troop also participates in the Friends of Scouting campaign.

# BREATHLESSLY HEALING



Mark packs nearly everything into the first chapter of his gospel. First, Jesus is baptized and tempted, and then preaches his first sermon. In five short verses we read about a baptism, ordination, and installation. It takes five more verses for Jesus to call his disciples, and seven more to preach on the Sabbath, cast out a demon and become famous in the region. Mark's gospel is nothing if not breathless, characterized by that one word that keeps popping up through the gospel: "immediately"!

And yet, the chapter is not finished. Jesus has preached and exorcised demons, but he has yet to heal someone. Today's reading reveals Jesus as healer. He heals Simon's mother-in-law of a fever. Immediately that evening, the sick from all around are already at the door. Actually, the whole town is at the door. Jesus exorcises, heals and grows in fame.

The Word of God in Jesus has broken into our troubled world, and immediately begins to bring good news and wholeness. Just as Mark shows Jesus healing and turning a normal city upside down, Christ comes into our daily routines with a word of new life, and we will be forever changed. Where are you broken and in need of restoration? Where do you face despair and need renewing waters of grace? Where do you hunger for the bread of good news?

The healings done by Jesus are a powerful sign that the forces of death and sickness do not have the last word. Yet Jesus is not the kind of faith healer we usually imagine. He does not seek fame and adoration from the crowd. Rather, he immediately goes to a place by himself to pray (Mark 1:35). Jesus knows that the ultimate sign of God's victory over sin and death is still in the future, in his crucifixion and the new life of the resurrection. And this is where God is pointing us, too.
